

# Stacking Building Blocks

“Building Blocks” quilt patterned in  
December/January 2008 issue of QUILT Magazine

## Materials You Will Need:

1/4 yard each of a red wood print, blue tool print,  
and black washer print  
1/2 yard of a tool panel print  
Fiberfill

## Cutting Directions:

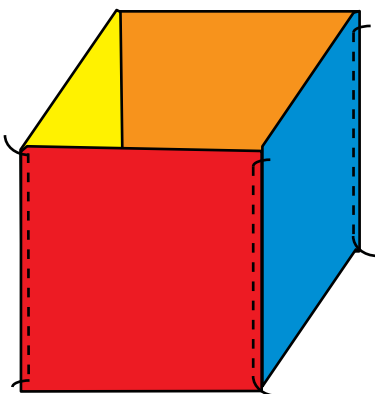
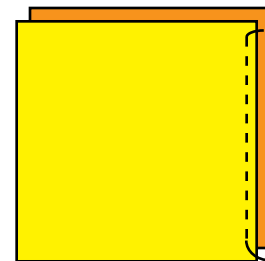
From the red wood print, blue tool print, and  
black washer print, cut a total of:  
(10) 7" squares

From the tool panel print, cut:  
(8) 7" squares cut from the blocks in the tool  
panel, including a 1/4" seam allowance  
around each block.

## Sewing Directions:

*(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Stitch (2) 7" squares together, starting and stopping  
1/4" from the edges and backstitching as shown. (Make 2)



2. Join the two pairs together, starting and stopping 1/4"  
from the edges and backstitching to form an open cube.

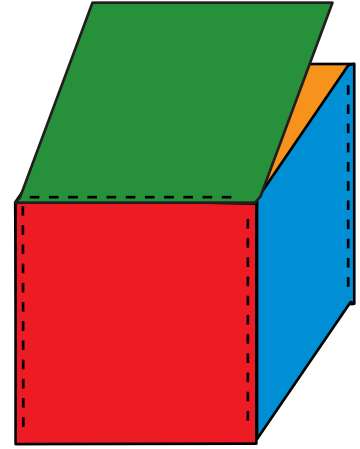


(Finished size: 6-1/2" square)

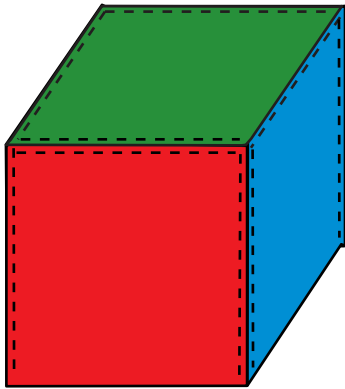

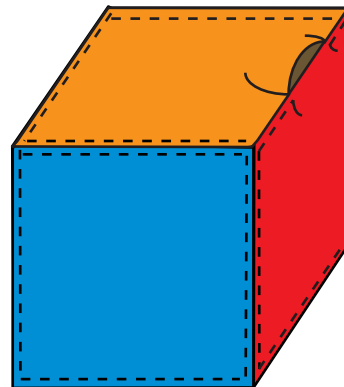
3. With the right side turned in on the open cube, attach a 7" square to one side of the cube.



4. In the same manner, attach the remaining 3 sides.



5. In the same way, attach a 7" square to the open end of the cube, stitching three sides closed and leaving a 4" opening on the last side, as shown.



6. Turn the block, right side out.

7. Stuff the block with fiberfill. Blind-stitch the opening closed. (Make 3 Blocks)
