## Octagonal Placemat (Makes (4) 18" x 13-1/2" placemats)

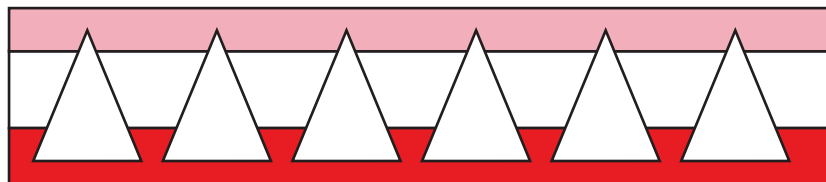
### Materials You Will Need:

- 2 yards of border print fabric
- 1 yard of red print fabric, includes binding
- Crib size of Warm & Natural batting

### Cutting Directions:

- From the border print, cut: (see note below)
- (24) triangles from template A
- (8) center sections from template B

\*\*Note: Align the lower edge of the templates along the same part of the stripe to insure that the print will line up when the sections are pieced together.

From the red print, cut:  
(4) 20" x 15" rectangles  
(8) 2-1/4" x 42" binding strips

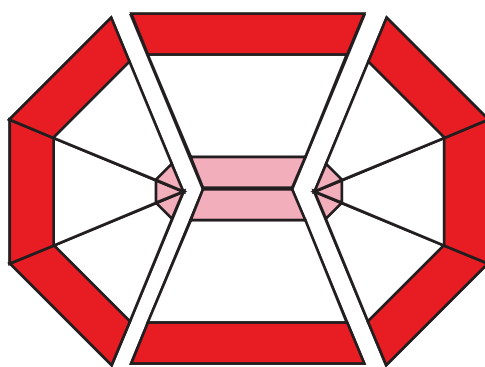
## Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

### 1. MAKING THE END SECTIONS

Sew 2 triangles together along one long edge, then sew a third triangle to the other edge, forming an end section. Make the other end section in the same way, being sure to keep the prints aligned as you stitch.

### 2. COMPLETING THE PLACEMAT

Sew the center sections together along the top edge. Pin an end section to each end of the placemat. Sew from the outer edge in along each pinned edge, stopping 1/4" from the corner of the placemat and backstitching at both ends. Press seams open at each corner.

### 3. FINISHING

Refer to the Basic Directions for tips on adding the backing and batting. Quilt as desired. Use the 2-1/4" red strips for binding.

## **Rectangular Placemat** (Makes (4) 18" x 12" placemats)

### Materials You Will Need:

4 yards of border print fabric  
1 yard of red print fabric, includes binding  
Crib size of Warm & Natural batting

### Cutting Directions:

From the border print, cut: (see note below)  
(8) 18-1/2" x 4" rectangles (border)  
(8) 12-1/2" x 4" rectangles (border)  
(4) 5" x 11" rectangles (fussy cut motif)

\*\*Note: Cut the border rectangles along the same part of the stripe to insure that the print will line up when the borders are mitered together.

From the red print, cut:  
(4) 20" x 14" rectangles  
(8) 2-1/4" x 42" binding strips

# Sewing Directions:

## 1. MAKING THE TOP

Refer to the Basic Directions to use (2) 18-1/2" x 4" and (2) 12-1/2" x 4" border print rectangles to form a mitered border around (1) 5" x 11" fussy-cut rectangle.

## 2. FINISHING

Refer to the Basic Directions for tips on adding the backing and batting. Quilt as desired. Use the 2-1/4" red strips for binding.

# Trivet (Makes (4) trivets that are about 10" across)

## Materials You Will Need:

- 1-1/2 yards of border print fabric, includes binding
- 3/4 yard of red print fabric
- (4) 12" squares of heat-resistant batting, such as Insul-Bright

## Cutting Directions:

From the border print, cut: (see note below)

(32) triangles from template A

(4) 2-1/4" x 42" binding strips

**\*\*Note:** Align the lower edge of the templates along the same part of the stripe to insure that the print will line up when the sections are pieced together. Each set of (8) triangles should match, but you can use different sections of the fabric for each set.

From the red print, cut:

(4) 12" squares

# Sewing Directions:

## 1. MAKING THE TRIVET

Sew 2 matching triangles together along one long edge, being sure to keep the prints aligned as you stitch. Sew the remaining triangles together in pairs in the same way. Sew 2 pairs together to make each half of a trivet. Sew 2 halves together to complete each trivet.

## 2. FINISHING

Refer to the Basic Directions for tips on adding the backing and batting. Quilt as desired. Use the 2-1/4" border print strips for binding.
