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Paisley on Parade

Finished Size: 46" x 52"

Finished Block: 6"

Number of Blocks: 42

Materials Needed:

1. POP-B #4 orange plaid	$\frac{3}{8}$ yd (.3 m)
2. POP-D #1 lime	$\frac{3}{8}$ yd (.3 m)
3. POP-D #3 purple	$\frac{3}{8}$ yd (.3 m)
4. POP-E #1 lime	$\frac{3}{8}$ yd (.3 m)
5. POP-F #1 pink	$\frac{3}{8}$ yd (.3 m)
6. POP-G #2 purple	$\frac{3}{8}$ yd (.3 m)
7. POP-G #4 orange	$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (.25 m)
8. POP-E #2 pink	$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (.25 m)
9. POP-E #3 yellow	$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (.25 m)
10. POP-C #2 teal	$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (.25 m)
11. POP-C #4 yellow	$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (.25 m)
12. POP-D #2 teal	$\frac{1}{4}$ yd (.25 m)
13. White tone on tone	$\frac{1}{2}$ yd (.5 m)
14. White polka dots	$\frac{1}{2}$ yd (.5 m)
15. Purple plaid (binding)	$\frac{1}{2}$ yd (.5 m)
16. Backing	2 yd (2 m)
17. Batting	52" x 58"

Cutting

WOF = Width of Fabric

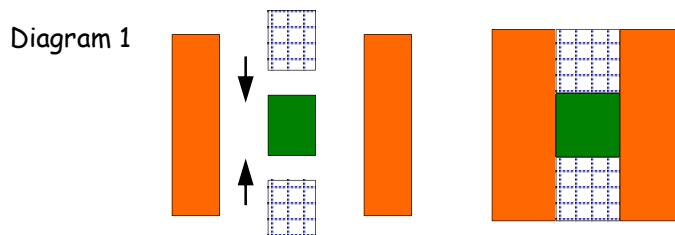
1. White polka dot fabric:
Cut 6 strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF
Cut these strips into 84 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
2. From each of fabrics #1 - #6
Cut three strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF
Cut these strips into:
Ten $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
Eight $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
Four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

3. From each fabric #8 - #12
Cut two strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF
Cut these strips into:
Six $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
Four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
4. From fabric #4 (POP-E #1 lime)
Cut four $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (corner stones)
5. From fabric #8 (POP-E #2 Pink)
Cut four $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
Cut two strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $50\frac{1}{2}$ "
Cut two strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ "
6. From fabric #13 (White tone on tone)
Cut two strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ "
Cut two strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $38\frac{1}{2}$ "
7. From fabric #15 (purple plaid)
Cut five strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF (binding)

Sewing

USE AN EXACT $\frac{1}{4}$ " SEAM ALLOWANCE

1. Make 42 blocks as shown in Diagram 1. Sew two polka dot squares to one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Press towards the center block. Then choose two identical $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and sew to each side of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square unit. Press towards the strips. Repeat to make 42 blocks.



- Sew blocks together in rows of six. See Diagram 2. Make seven rows in total. See Diagram 4 on page three for placement of blocks. Alternate the direction you press the seams for each row.

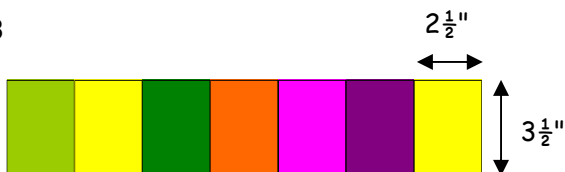

Please refer to Diagram 4.

- Sew one white inner border strip to each side of the quilt. Press all seams towards the borders.
- Sew one white inner border strip to the top of the quilt and one to the bottom of the quilt. Press.
- Sew 21 of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips together in a row. See Diagram 3. Repeat.

- Sew one pink $1\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to each end of these two rows. Press seams in one direction. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt.
- Sew 18 of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strips together in a row. Repeat. Sew one pink $1\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $3\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to each end of these two rows. Sew one $3\frac{1}{2}$ " green square to each end of these two rows. Press seams in one direction.

Sew one strip to the top of the quilt and one to the bottom.

- Sew one of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $50\frac{1}{2}$ " pink outer border strips to each side of the quilt. Press.
- Sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $44\frac{1}{2}$ " to the top and one to the bottom of the quilt.

FINISHING YOUR QUILT:

- Cut backing and batting at least three inches larger than the quilt on all sides.
- Using a hard surface, secure the backing (right side down) with masking tape or clamps.
- Lay your batting and quilt top (right side up) on backing, smoothing away any wrinkles.
- Baste layers together using safety pins or thread.
- Quilt as desired.
- Square and trim up your quilt around all sides.
- Sew your binding fabric end to end using a mitred seam. Press seams open. Fold in half length-wise, wrong sides together and press.
- Apply binding by aligning the raw edges of the quilt and the binding. Sew through all layers using a generous $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
- Fold binding to the back of your quilt and hand stitch to finish.
- Sew a label to the back and your quilt is ready to be loved!
