

It's a Wrap!

"Bound to Please" patterned in
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Piece squares with different width and texture strips, and then cut each square to create a variety of blocks. The result? A one-of-a-kind, stripy scarf that is both comfortable and cosmopolitan.

Helpful Hints:

Prevent silk and velveteen from slipping while sewing by keeping silk piece on top of any fabric pair and pull gently to keep fabrics together. Keep velveteen on the bottom of any fabric pair. Always press velveteen seams flat, otherwise the seams will be too thick.

Materials You Will Need:

1/4 yard of light blue cotton
1/4 yard of light blue silk
1/4 yard of light blue velveteen
1/4 yard of burgundy cotton
1/4 yard of burgundy silk
1/4 yard of burgundy velveteen
1/2 yard of burgundy silk for backing
4-1/2" x 75" piece of batting

Cutting Directions:

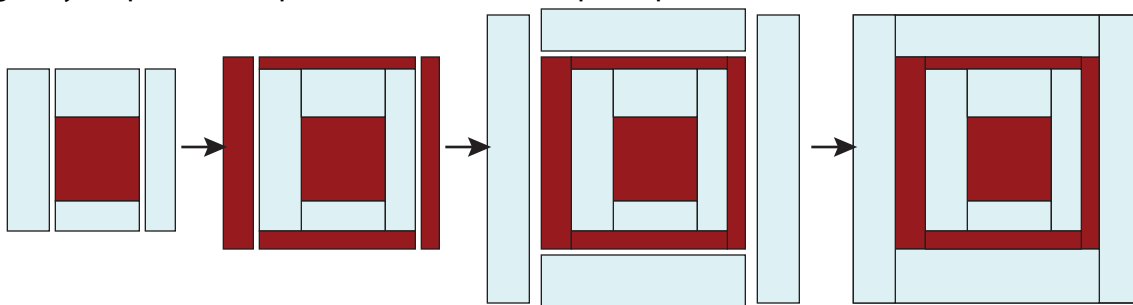
From the 1/4 yard fabrics, cut a total of:
(4) 4" squares (2 light blue, 2 burgundy)
(12) 1" to 2-1/2" x 42" strips

From the burgundy silk for backing, cut:
(2) 5-1/2" x 42" strips
(2) 1" to 2-1/2" x 42" strips

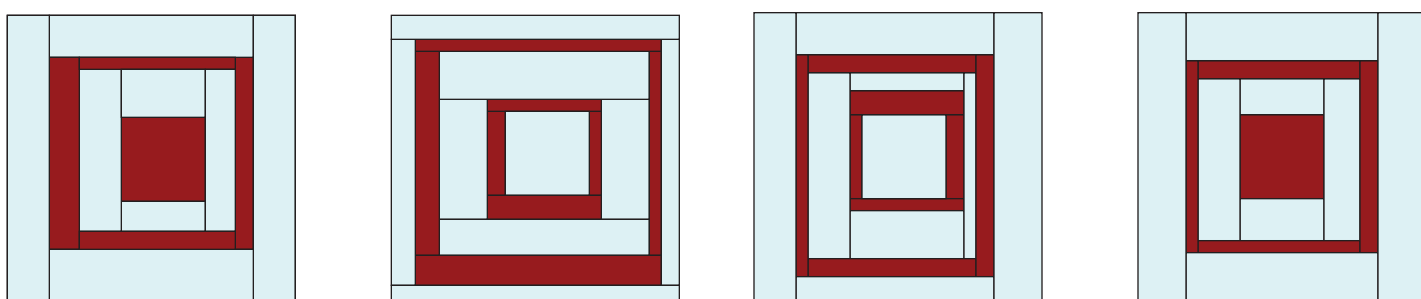
Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

Note: *This scarf has a scrappy look; vary strip widths in each "frame" as desired. Vary fabric texture (cotton, silk, velveteen) as desired among frames.*

1. Sew burgundy strips to opposite sides of a 4" light blue square. Press and trim strips even with the square. Sew burgundy strips to the top and bottom of the square, press, and trim excess to frame the square.

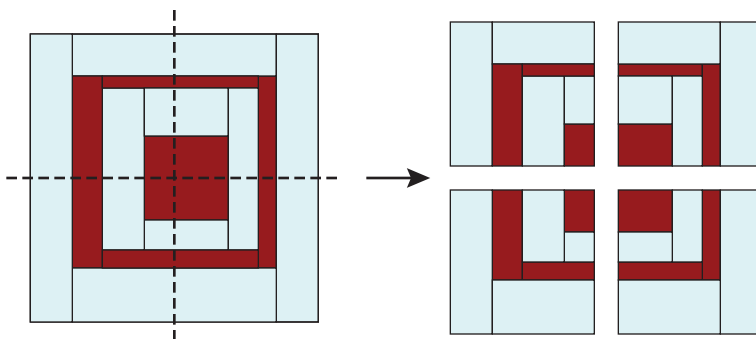


2. Repeat, alternating frame colors, to create a light blue/burgundy pieced square measuring at least 12" square. See pieced square examples below for guidance.



3. Make a total of four pieced squares, (2) with light blue centers and (2) with burgundy centers.

4. Cut each square in half twice to create (4) squares. Trim each to measure 5-1/2" square, fussy cutting if necessary to help "center" the center square.

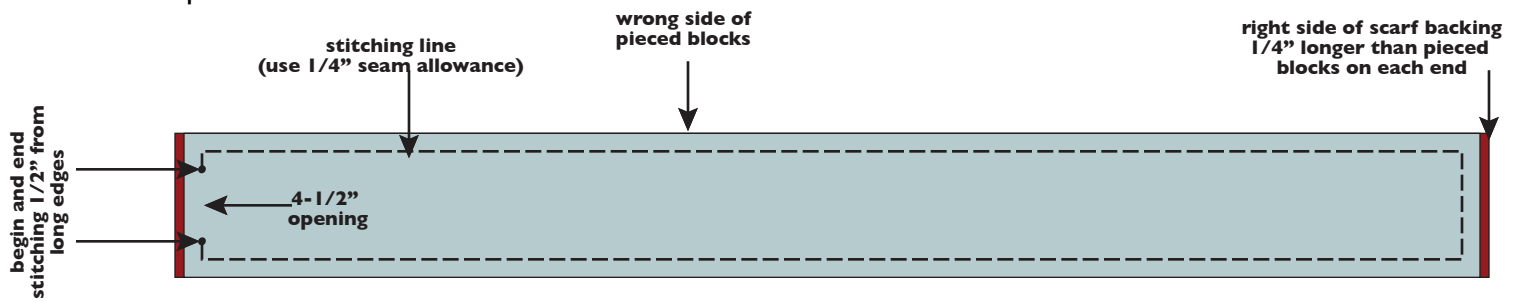


5. Referring to scarf layout for guidance, arrange (15) squares into a long strip in a pleasing order. Sew together. You will have (1) square leftover.



6. Sew the (2) 5-1/2" x 42" burgundy silk strips short ends together to create the scarf back. Trim to measure 76" long.

7. Pin top and backing right sides together. The silk backing will be slightly longer than the top to make turning it right side out easier. Beginning on the short end with the excess silk backing fabric, sew around all (4) sides, leaving a 4-1/2" opening on the first short end. Back-stitch beginning and end for strength when turning right side out. Clip corners.



8. Layer batting on wrong side of scarf backing. Gently feed hand through scarf tube and grab the far scarf corners while pinching the corners of the batting. Gently pull the batting through the tube while slowly turning it right side out, keeping hold of the pinched corners. Be careful to keep the edges of the batting in the side seams of the tube, and not to stretch the batting. Sew turning hole closed.

FINISHING

Quilt scarf in a diamond pattern to secure batting.
