## Snowmen Sham

### Materials You Will Need:

1/2 yard of a green print  
1/4 yard of a red print  
1-1/4 yards of a blue print  
1-1/8 yards of a snowman stripe  
20-1/2" x 40-1/2" piece of batting (optional)

### Cutting Directions:

From the green print, cut:  
(1) 14-1/2" x 22-1/2" rectangle

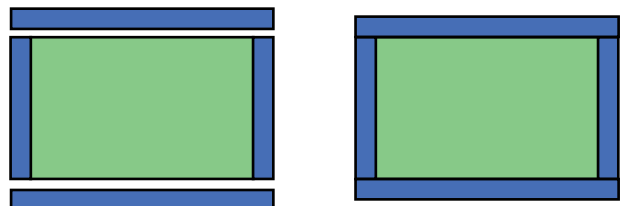
From the red print, cut:  
(2) 2" x 17-1/2" strips  
(2) 2" x 28-1/2" strips

From the blue print, cut:  
(2) 2" x 25-1/2" strips  
(2) 2" x 14-1/2" strips  
(2) 20-1/2" x 27" rectangles

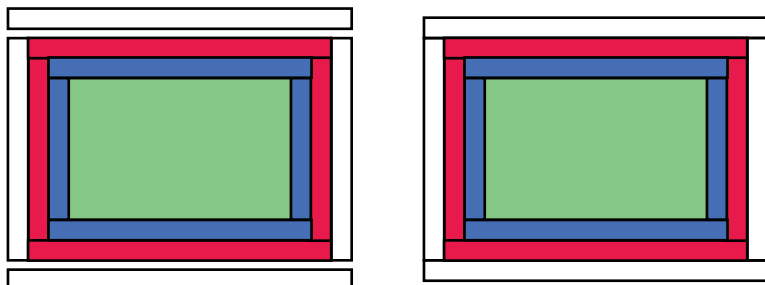
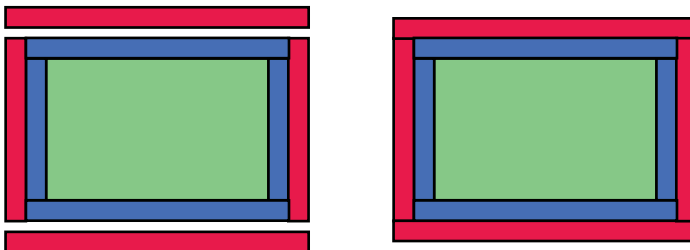
From the snowman stripe, cut:  
(2) 3-1/2" x 20-1/2" strips, fussy cut to center  
the snowmen stripe  
(2) 3-1/2" x 34-1/2" strips

### Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Stitch (2) 2" x 14-1/2" blue strips to the sides of (1) 14-1/2" x 22-1/2" green rectangle. Press. Stitch a 2" x 25-1/2" blue strip to the top and bottom of the rectangle unit.

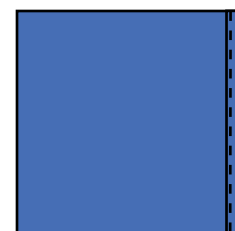


2. Stitch (2) 2" x 17-1/2" red strips to the sides of the center rectangle. Stitch (1) 2" x 28-1/2" red strip to the top and bottom of the center rectangle.

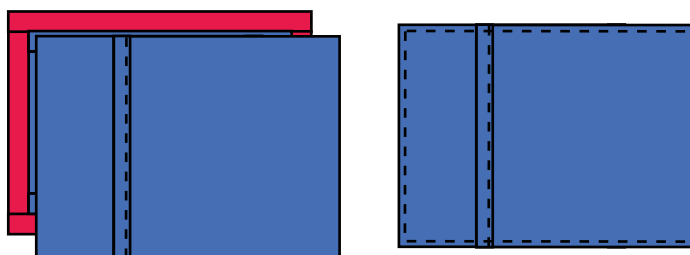


3. Stitch (2) 3-1/2" x 20-1/2" snowman strips to the side of the unit, making sure that the snowmen are facing outward. Stitch (1) 3-1/2" x 34-1/2" snowman strips to the top and one to the bottom of the pillow front, making sure that the snowmen are facing up on both strips.

4. Fold over 1" on a 20-1/2" side of (1) 20-1/2" x 27" blue rectangle. Press, then fold over 1" again to make a back piece. Topstitch to hem. (Make 2 back pieces)



5. On a flat surface, place the pillow front, right side up. (If you'd like a firmer pillow case, place the batting under the pillow front.) Place the two back pieces, right side down, overlapping the hemmed edges in the center of the pillow front, and matching raw edges all the way around. Pin in place and stitch around all four sides of the pillow sham. Clip corners and turn through the opening in the center. Insert pillow.



## Snowmen Pillow

### Materials You Will Need:

- 1/2 yard of a cream print
- Scrap of a red print
- Batting scrap (optional)
- 1 sprig of artificial berries (found in floral section of craft store)
- (8) 3/4" black buttons
- Lipstick (optional)
- Fusible web
- SoftTouch® Poly-fil Supreme® by Fairfield

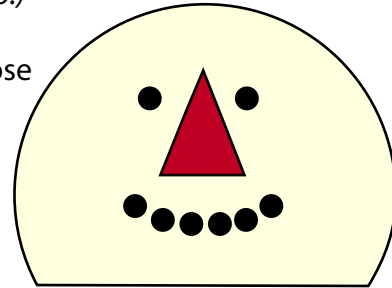
## Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Trace (1) of Template B onto the paper side of the fusible web. Cut out 1/4" beyond the drawn line. Following manufacturer's directions, iron the piece to the wrong side of the red fabric. Cut out on the drawn line.

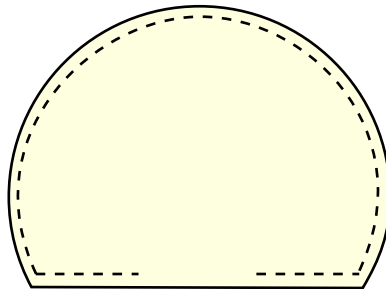
2. Cut out (2) half circle shapes from the cream print, using Template A. *(If you'd like a firmer pillow, cut out 1 additional shape, using the template, out of the batting scrap.)*

3. Refer to pillow photo for placement; place the Template B nose on the right side of one of the cream print shapes and fuse in place.

4. Place the 3/4" black buttons on the pillow front to form eyes and a mouth. Mark where you'd like them and stitch them on.



5. *(If using the extra batting shape, place that down first.)* Place the front of the snowman face, right side up. Place the back of the snowman face, right side down. Pin together and stitch all the way around, leaving a 6" opening in the bottom for turning. Turn pillow right side out, but do not stuff it yet.



6. Take the berry stem and cut little sprigs from the main stem. Count how many sprigs you have and place pins around the top of the snowman head to mark where you would like them to be placed, making sure that they are somewhat evenly spaced.

7. Unwrap the floral tape from the bottom, exposing the little wires of each berry sprig. Carefully insert the sprigs into the pillow where you marked. *(It is easiest if you can work them in between the seam, but it is kind of tricky to get them in there.)* It will take some patience to get them in, but they will go in eventually. Once they are through the fabric, reach into the inside of the pillow and fold the little wires back *(like you would a brad or paper fastener)*. This will keep them from pulling out easily.

8. Stuff the pillow with fiberfill and slipstitch the opening shut. Use lipstick to add rosy cheeks to your snowman, if desired.
