Apron

Materials You Will Need:

- (1) apron panel from the Cherry Picked collection by Wilmington Prints
(Instructions for assembling the apron are included on the panel.)

Placemat (Makes 4)

Materials You Will Need:

- 2-1/4 yards of red check with cherry stripe
- Fairfield Natural Cotton batting

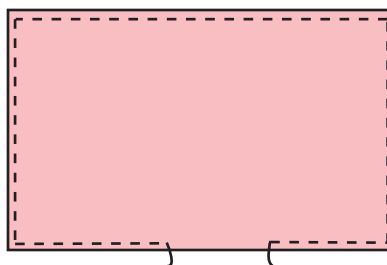
Cutting Directions:

- From the red check with cherry stripe, cut:
(8) 14" x 19" rectangles

- From the batting, cut:
(4) 14" x 19" rectangles

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. With right sides together, pin (2) cherry rectangles to (1) batting rectangle. Sew around the outside edge, leaving a 4" opening on one of the sides. Turn right sides out and whip stitch opening closed. Press. Topstitch 2" from outer edge around the entire place mat. (Make 4)



Tea Towel

Materials You Will Need:

4" x 8" cherry motif rectangle
Red tea towel

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Cut out a 4" x 8" cherry motif rectangle from the specialty prints panel. Press 1/4" seam under. Center the rectangle on your tea towel and top stitch the edge of the rectangle to the tea towel.



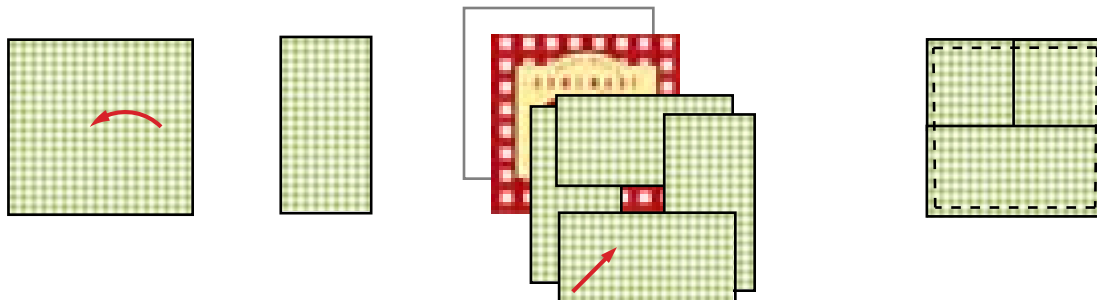
Coaster (Makes 4)

Materials You Will Need:

(4) 4" squares from the specialty prints panel
(16) 4" squares of green check fabric
(4) 4" squares of plastic sheeting

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Iron green checked squares in half, right side of the fabric facing out.
2. Layer one plastic square, a cherry decorative square (face up), then (4) green check rectangles so the raw edges are on the outside edges and the folded edges are towards the inside.
3. Pin and sew around the outside at 1/4". Turn using the interlocking rectangles and they will then be your backing.

Dinner Napkin (Makes 4)

Materials You Will Need:

1-1/4 yards each of a green check and a cherry print fabric

Cutting Directions:

From each of the green check and cherry print, cut:

(4) 20" squares

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Sew (1) 20" green check square, right sides together, to (1) 20" cherry print square leaving a 2" opening for turning. Turn, press and top stitch 1/4" from outside edge.

Pot Holder (Makes 2)

Materials You Will Need:

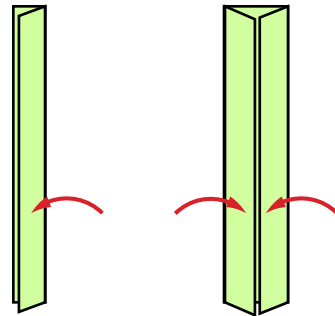
(4) 6-1/2" squares of a cherry motif print

(2) 6-1/2" squares of Fairfield Natural Cotton Batting

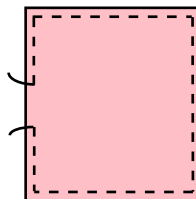
(2) 1" x 4" strips of green check fabric

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Using your green check strips, iron in half long ways, then iron raw edges into middle seam. Top stitch open edge closed.



2. To assemble, lay one batting square down, then a specialty square (right side up). Loop your green checked strip in half and pin it in the right corner. Place the other specialty square on top (wrong side up). Pin and sew at 1/4" leaving a 2" opening to turn. Turn and stitch opening closed. (Make 2)



Pot Plate

Materials You Will Need:

- (2) 10-1/2" x 12" pieces from the cherry motif prints pael
- (1) 10-1/2" x 12" piece of Fairfield Natural Cotton Batting

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Lay (1) batting square down, then (1) cherry motif square (right side up). Place the second cherry motif square on top (wrong side up). Pin and sew at 1/4" leaving a 2" opening to turn. Turn and stitch opening closed.
