## Materials You Will Need:

- 1-3/8 yards of a black star print
- 1/4 yard of a purple star print
- 1/4 yard of a green star print
- 1/4 yard of an orange circle print
- 1/4 yard of a stripe
- 5" square of black felt
- Foundation fabric or paper
- Batting
- Parachute clip with reflector (available at most craft or fabric stores)
- (3) daisy buttons: (1) large, (2) small (optional)

## Cutting Directions:

### Black Stars

- (3) 14-1/2" x 15-1/2" pieces
- (2) 5-1/2" x 42" strips
- (2) 2-1/4" x 5" pieces
- (2) 2-1/4" x 8-1/2" pieces
- (2) 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" pieces
- (2) 2" x 15-1/2" pieces

### Purple Stars

- (2) 1" x 9-1/2" pieces
- (2) 1" x 8-1/2" pieces

### Green Stars

- (2) 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" pieces
- (2) 1-1/2" x 11-1/2" pieces

### Stripe

- (1) 1-1/2" x 42" strip

### Black Felt

- (2) 1-1/2" x 3" pieces

### Batting

- (2) 15-1/2" x 14-1/2" squares
- (2) 5-1/2" x 42" strips

# Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

## MAKING THE BAG FRONT

1. **Note:** Printed foundation templates should measure 5" wide from dotted line to dotted line. Trace the foundation templates provided onto sheer foundation fabric or paper and paper piece each section according to the numerical sequence and fabrics listed. Trim the fabrics even with the dashed cutting lines. Sew the sections together noting orientation.

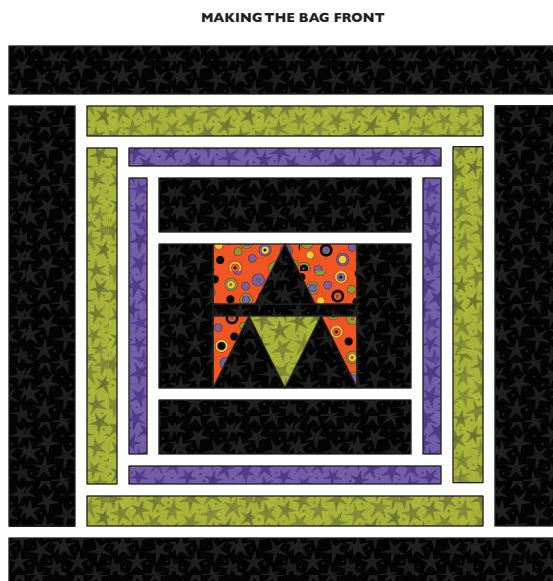
2. Sew 2-1/4" x 5" black star pieces to opposite sides of the witch block. Sew 2-1/4" x 8-1/2" black star pieces to the top and bottom.

3. Fold the 1-1/2" x 42" stripe strip right sides together lengthwise. Stitch, using a 1/4" seam allowance down the long edge to make a tube. Turn right side out. Cut (2) 12" lengths. Referring to the photo, baste these striped legs in place along the black star bottom border. Note: Pin legs near the block center to prevent accidentally stitching through them as you add borders.

4. Sew 1" x 8-1/2" purple star pieces to opposite sides of the block unit. Sew 1" x 9-1/2" purple star pieces to the top and bottom, being sure to secure the striped legs as you stitch.

5. Sew 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" green star pieces to opposite sides of the block unit. Sew 1-1/2" x 11-1/2" green star pieces to the top and bottom.

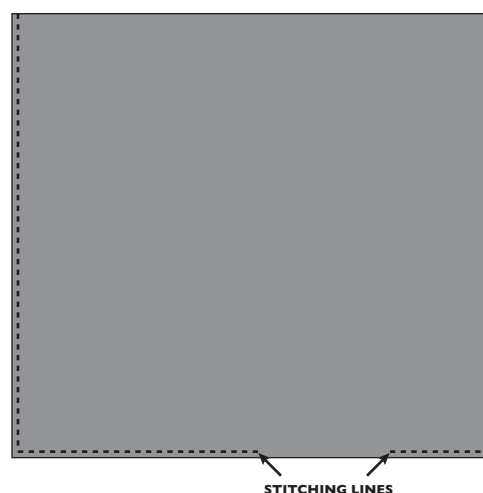
6. Sew 2-1/2" x 11-1/2" black star pieces to opposite sides of the block unit. Sew 2" x 15-1/2" pieces to the top and bottom.



## ASSEMBLY

1. Baste batting to the wrong sides of the bag front and back. Quilt the bag front if desired. With right sides together, sew together on (3) sides, leaving the top open. Be careful not to catch the legs in these seams. Turn right side out.

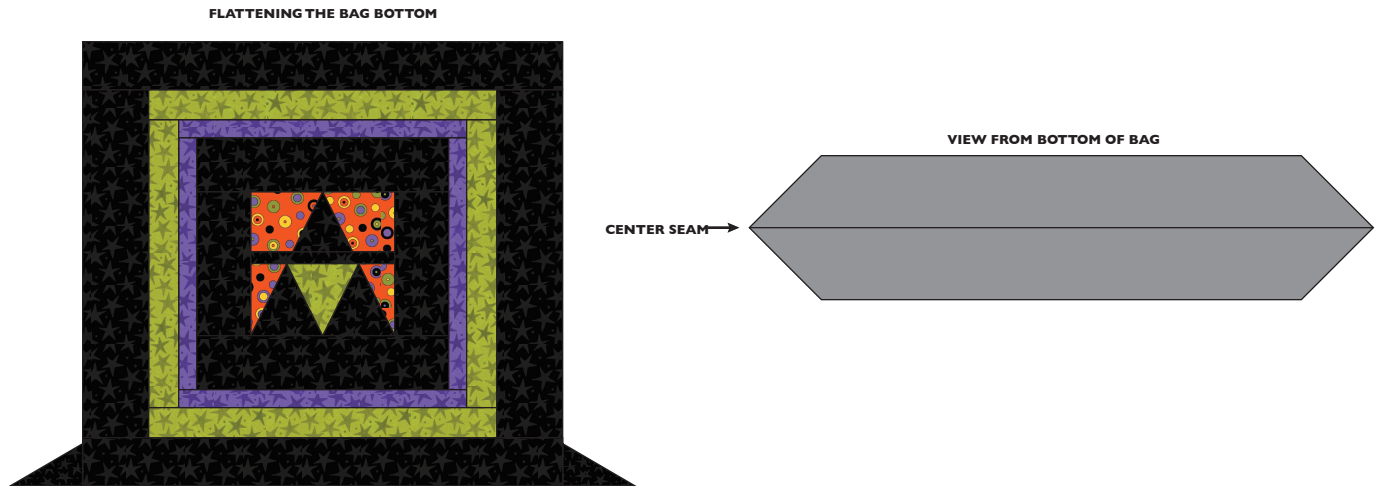
2. To make the lining, sew (2) 14-1/2" x 15-1/2" black star pieces right sides together along (2) shorter edges and (1) long edge, leaving an opening for turning along the long edge.



3. Insert the outer bag into the lining so that right sides are facing. Sew along the top edge and turn right side out through the hole in the lining. Top stitch around the top of the bag and whipstitch the lining hole closed.

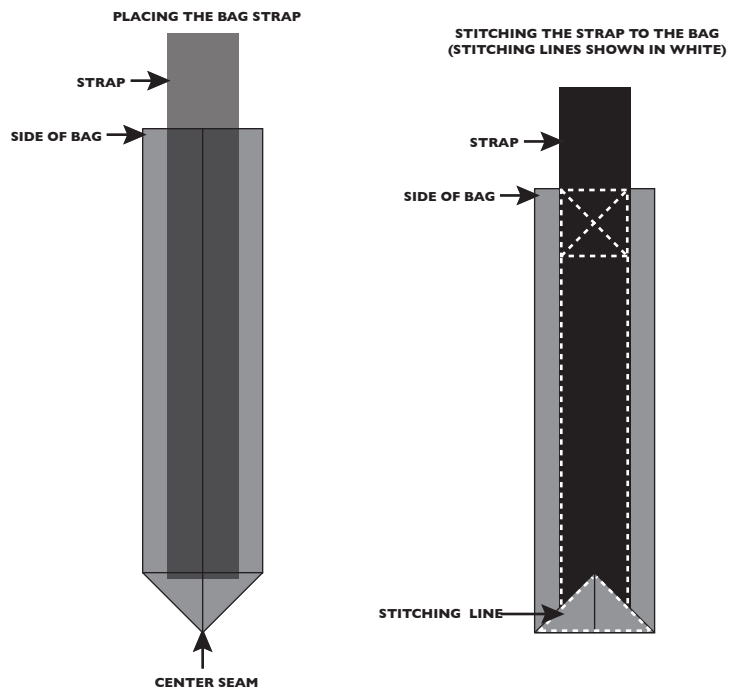
4. Attach a 5-1/2" x 42" batting strip to the wrong side of a 5-1/2" x 42" black star strip. Fold the strip lengthwise, right sides together, and stitch down the long edge. Turn right side out and fold so the seam runs down the middle of one side of the strap. Topstitch the long edges of the strap. Make a second strap.

5. Flatten the bag bottom and finger press the side and bottom of the bag, centering the seam on the sides and bottom and creating a 2-1/2" width where the strap will be attached.



6. Pin a strap in place along the fold line on the side of the bag, allowing the raw strap end to extend slightly beyond the bottom fold line.

Fold the point tip of the bag up over the raw strap end and stitch several times to secure. Continue sewing up each side of the strap and stitch an "X" at the top to add strength to the handle. Repeat with the second strap on the other side.



7. Try the bag on the child and trim the straps (leaving one long to go over the shoulder and the second short) stitching both straps to the parachute clip following the manufacturer's directions.

8. To make the witch shoes, fold a 1-1/2" x 3" black felt piece in half widthwise. Cut a triangle in the folded fabric using the triangle template. Stitch along one cut edge as shown.

Fold the top triangles down to create a wing effect. Insert a striped leg into the shoe and whipstitch to secure, adding a daisy button if desired. Repeat for second shoe/leg. Tie knots in striped legs.

9. Stitch a daisy button to the witch hat if desired.
