Materials You Will Need:

Small Bin

3/8 yard of a blue/pink floral
3/8 yard of a pink/white print
1/4 yard of a teal print
1/4 yard of a light green print
3/4 yard of 20" wide medium weight
fusible interfacing
(1) coordinating button

Medium Bin

1/2 yard of a white floral
1/2 yard of a green/multi stripe
1/4 yard of a yellow floral
1/4 yard of a pink/white print
1-1/4 yards of 20" wide medium weight
fusible interfacing
(1) coordinating button

Cutting Directions:

Small Bin

From the blue/pink floral, cut:

(1) 10" x 20" piece

From the pink/white print, cut:

(1) 10" x 20" piece

From the teal print, cut:

(1) 6" x 12" piece

From the light green print, cut:

(1) 5" x 10" piece

From the fusible interfacing, cut:

(2) 10" x 20" pieces

(1) 6" x 12" piece

(1) 5" x 10" piece

Medium Bin

From the white floral, cut:

(1) 14-1/2" x 27-1/2" piece

From the green multi stripe, cut:

(1) 14-1/2" x 27-1/2" piece

From the yellow floral, cut:

(1) 6" x 12" piece

From the pink/white print, cut:

(1) 5" x 10" piece

From the fusible interfacing, cut:

(2) 14-1/2" x 27-1/2" pieces

(1) 6" x 12" piece

(1) 5" x 10" piece

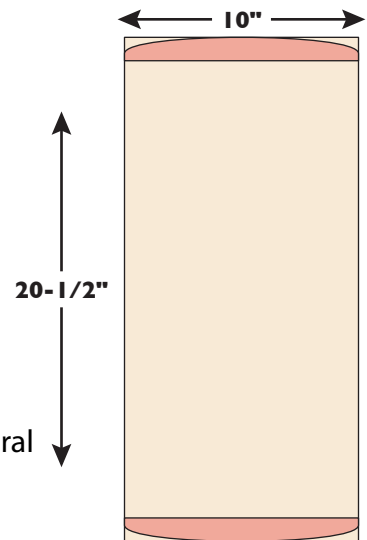
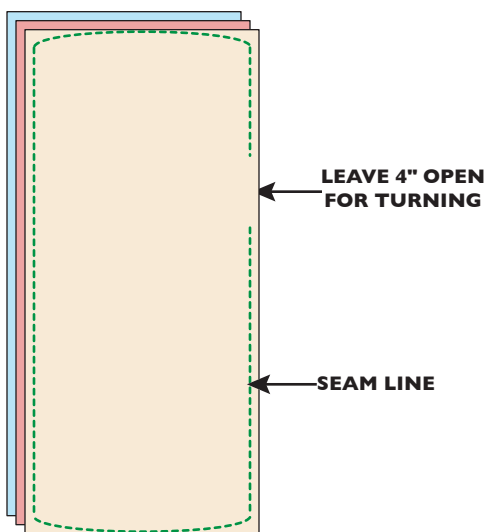
Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

MAKING THE SMALL BIN

1. Using the template provided, trace a curved edge along both short sides of a 10" x 20" piece of fusible interfacing.

2. Layer the wrong side of the 10" x 20" pink/white small print piece on the fusible side of the interfacing and fuse in place following manufacturer's directions.

3. Fuse the second 10" x 20" piece of fusible interfacing to the blue/pink floral piece.

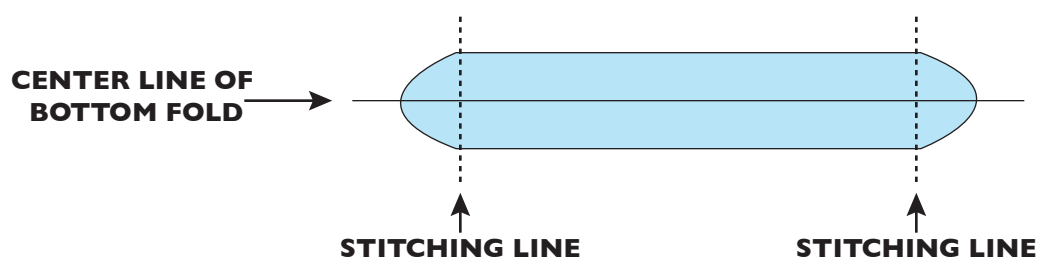


4. Layer the pieces from step 2 and 3 fabric sides together and secure with pins. With the marked piece of interfacing on top, stitch around the entire piece, using a 1/4" seam allowance on the straight edges and stitching ON the curved edge. Leave a 4" opening along one of the straight sides.

5. Turn the entire piece right side out and shape the curved edge with a small pointed tool. Press heavily with steam. Turn the raw edges of the opening in 1/4" and stitch. Press and steam again.

6. Fold the piece in with the curved edge matching and the blue/pink floral fabric on the inside. Stitch along each straight side with a 1/4" seam allowance. Mark the bottom fold with a pin.

7. Fold the base, aligning a side seam with the pin to form a triangle. Stitch across, 1-1/2" in from the tip. Repeat on the opposite side.



8. Turn the bin right side out and fold curved edge over.

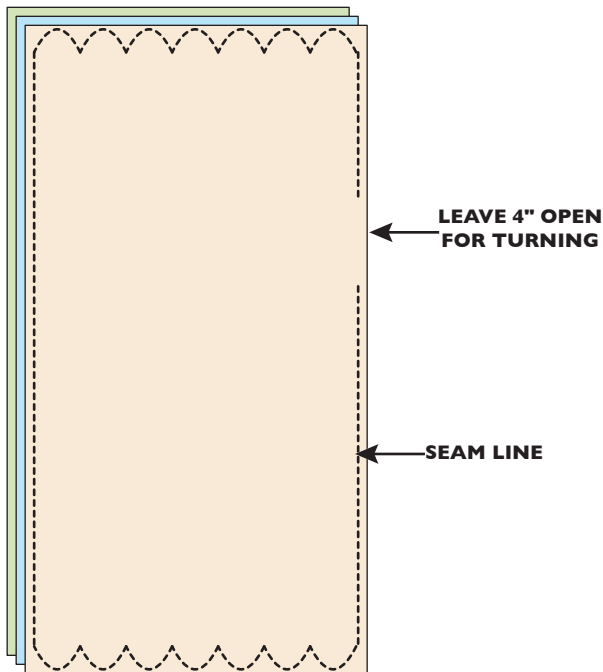
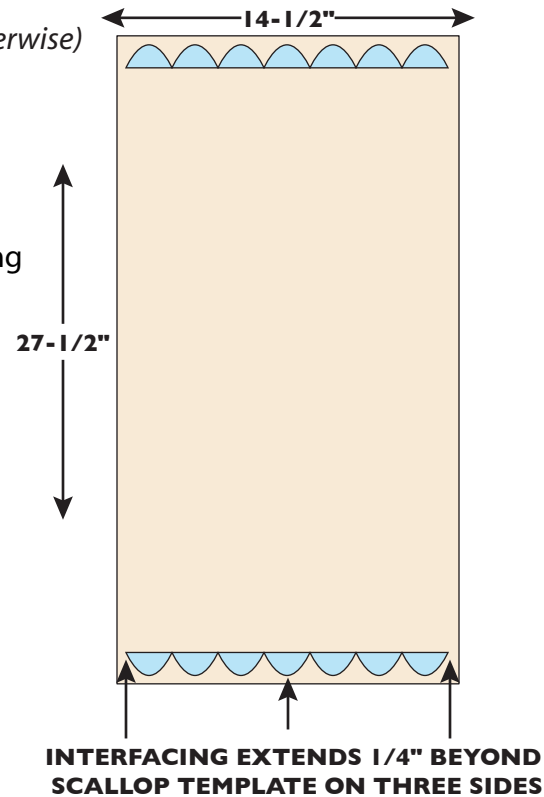
Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

MAKING THE MEDIUM BIN

1. Using the template provided, trace a continuing scalloped pattern along both short sides of a 14-1/2" x 27-1/2" piece of fusible interfacing, positioning the curved scallop 1/4" from the edge of the interfacing.

2. Layer the wrong side of the 14-1/2" x 27-1/2" green/multi stripe piece on the fusible side of the interfacing and fuse in place following manufacturer's directions.

3. Fuse the second 14-1/2" x 27-1/2" piece of fusible interfacing to the white floral piece.



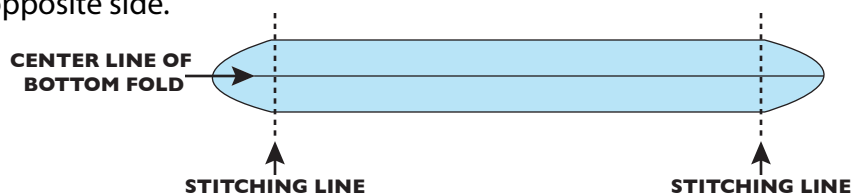
4. Layer the pieces from step 2 and 3 fabric sides together and secure with pins. With the marked piece of interfacing on top, stitch around the entire piece, using a 1/4" seam allowance on the straight edges and stitching ON the scallop lines. Leave a 4" opening along one of the straight sides.

5. Trim excess material on the rounded scallops to 1/8" and clip the scallop points near the stitching.

6. Turn the entire piece right side out and shape the scallops with a small pointed tool. Press heavily with steam. Turn the raw edges of the opening in 1/4" and stitch. Press and steam again.

7. Fold the piece in with the scallops matching and the white floral fabric on the inside. Stitch along each straight side with a 1/4" seam allowance. Mark the bottom fold with a pin.

8. Fold the base, aligning a side seam with the pin to form a triangle. Stitch across, 2-1/2" in from the tip. Repeat on the opposite side.



9. Turn the bin right side out and fold scalloped edge over.

ADDING THE FLOWER (for both bins)

1 Trace a large flower template to the fusible interfacing. Press the large flower to the wrong side of the 6" x 12" fabric piece folded in half, right sides together. Pin layers together and cut along the drawn line. Sew around the flower using a 1/4" seam allowance. Cut a slit in one side of the flower, turn right side out, shape the petals with a small pointed tool, and press.

2 Repeat step 1 using the small flower template, fusible interfacing, and the 5" x 10" fabric piece.

3 Stitch both flowers to the fabric bin, using a button to hide the stitches.
