Tulip Pillow (12" x 22")

Materials You Will Need:

1 panel: Q1409-86251-173
1/3 yard green fabric
1-1/4 yards cording
12" x 22" Country Air™ pillow insert by Fairfield

Cutting Directions:

From the printed panel, cut:
(1) 8" x 22-1/2" piece with the red tulip motif
centered in the rectangle.

From the green fabric, cut:
(1) 12-1/2" x 22-1/2" rectangle for the back
(2) 2-3/4" x 22-1/2" strips

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Sew the cording to each long side of the printed panel, 1/2" from the edge with the cording facing the center.
2. Right sides together, pin a 2-3/4" x 22-1/2" green strip to each long side of the tulip panel. Stitch the strips to the panel to complete the pillow front which should measure 12-1/2" x 22-1/2".
3. Pin the pillow front to the 12-1/2" x 22-1/2" green rectangle right sides together. Sew around three sides and through all layers, leaving an opening on one side for turning. Clip the corners to reduce bulk and turn the pillow right side out. Insert the pillow form and slipstitch the opening closed.

Hourglass Pillow (16" square)

Materials You Will Need:

1/2 yard cream fabric (or 1 fat quarter)
1/2 yard green fabric (or 2 fat quarters)*
2 yards cording
16" Home Elegance™ pillow insert by Fairfield

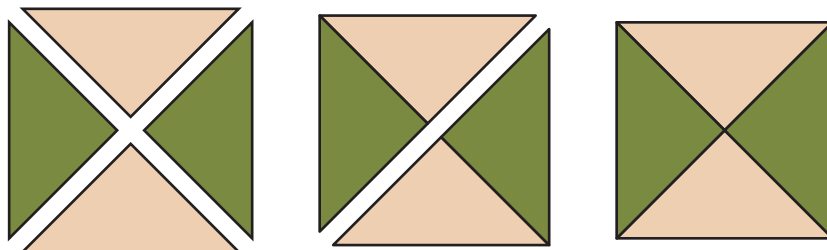
Cutting Directions:

From the cream, cut:
(1) 16-7/8" square. Cut the square in half on both diagonals to make (4) triangles.

From the green fabric, cut:
(1) 16-7/8" square. Cut the square in half on both diagonals to make (4) triangles.
(1) 16-1/2" square for the pillow back.

Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Stitch (2) cream and (2) green triangles together as shown to make the pillow front.



2. Stitch the cording 1/2" from the edge of the pillow top, with the trim facing toward the center of the pillow. At the corners, gently round the corner rather than making a right angle. At the beginning and the end, leave the trim extend out to the edge of the pillow front.

3. Add a decorative button to the center of the pillow front.

4. Pin the pillow front to the 16-1/2" green square right sides together. Sew around three sides and through all layers, leaving an opening on one side for turning. Clip the corners to reduce bulk and turn the pillow right side out. Insert the pillow form and slipstitch the opening closed.
