## Horsing Around Pillow

### Materials You Will Need:

1/2 yard of a light brown lasso print  
1/4 yard of a dark brown lasso print  
1 yard of a border print  
1/2 yard of 18" wide, light-weight,  
double-sided, fusible webbing  
template plastic  
thread for appliqués  
14" square Fairfield pillow form

### Cutting Directions:

From the light brown lasso print, cut:  
(1) 14-1/2" square for pillow back  
(1) 10" square for the appliqué background

From the border print, cut:  
(4) 2-3/4" x 16" strips

### Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Using template plastic and the paper patterns provided, make templates for the cowboy hat and cowboy hat band.
2. Trace one cowboy hat and one cowboy hat band onto the paper side of the fusible webbing. Cut out each shape leaving 1/4" margin beyond the traced lines. Following the manufacturer's directions, fuse the traced cowboy hat shape to the wrong side of the dark brown lasso print fabric. Cut out the motif on the traced line. In the same manner, fuse the traced hat band to the wrong side of the light brown lasso print fabric. Cut out this motif on the traced line.
3. Fuse the prepared hat band to the right side of the cowboy hat motif. Center the cowboy hat on top of the 10" light brown lasso square and fuse in place. Overcast the raw edges of both shapes with a zigzag stitch.

4. Sew the border print strips to the sides of the appliqué square one at a time, noting the orientation of the border strips, matching the center point of each strip to the center points on the sides of the square, and starting and stopping each seam 1/4" from the edges of the square. Miter each corner following the mitering instructions in the general directions.

#### FINISHING:

With right sides together, sew the pillow front to the 14-1/2" light brown lasso print square, leaving an opening for turning. Clip corners and turn right sides out. Press. Insert pillow form and stitch opening closed.

## Horsing Around Crib Quilt

### Materials You Will Need:

1 cowboy panel	1/8 yard of a dark brown lasso
7/8 yard of a yellow dot	1-1/3 yards of a cowboy border print
1/2 yard of a blue dot	50" x 70" piece of 60/40 machine blend Fairfield batting
1/8 yard of a light brown lasso	3-1/2 yards of backing

### Cutting Directions:

Cut the cowboy panel to measure 22" x 40"

From the yellow dot, cut:

- (2) 1-1/2" x 40" strips
- (2) 1-1/2" x 24" strips
- (5) 2-1/4" x 42" strips for binding

From the blue dot, cut:

- (2) 2-1/2" x 28" strips
- (4) 7" squares

From the light brown lasso, cut:

- (4) small cowboy hat bands using fusible web

From the dark brown lasso, cut:

- (4) small cowboy hats using fusible web

From the cowboy border print, cut:

- (2) 7" x 46-1/2" strips, fussy cut from the blue line above the boots to the green line below the yellow stripe
- (2) 7" x 28-1/2" strips, fussy cut from the blue line above the boots to the green line below the yellow stripe

### Sewing Directions: *(Seam allowance is 1/4" unless stated otherwise)*

1. Starting with the panel, stitch a 1 1/2" x 40" strip of yellow dot fabric to the sides. Repeat this with the 1 1/2" x 24" yellow dot strip on the top and bottom.
2. Using the 2 1/2" x 42" blue dot strip, pin and stitch to each side of the quilt. Repeat this using the 2 1/2" x 28" blue dot strip to the top and bottom.
3. Using the template provided, trace the small cowboy hat and band onto some fusible web. Iron the hats onto the dark lasso fabric, and the bands onto the light lasso fabric. Cut them out. Center one hat/band in each blue square and iron to secure. Zigzag stitch around the edge using a light brown thread so that the cowboy hat looks real.
4. Sew a blue 7" square to each end of the (2) 7" x 28 1/2" border strips. Pin the 7" x 46 1/2" border strip to the sides of the quilt, stitch and press. Pin the (2) 7" X 28 1/2" strips with the blocks on the end to the top and bottom of the quilt, stitch and press.
5. Refer to the General Directions for backing, quilting, and binding; use the 2-1/4" yellow dot strips to finish the quilt.
