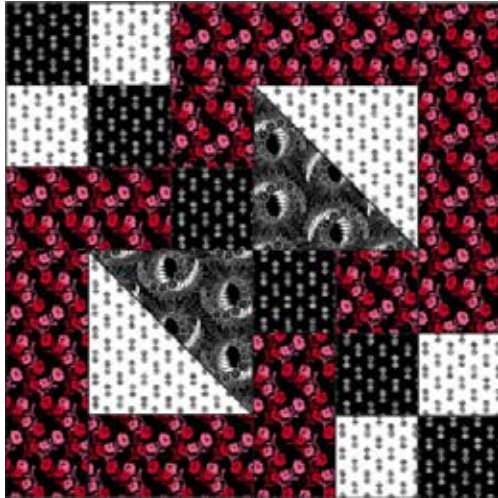


# Fabric Stash Block

## Linking Roses

This block features a surefire set of bold corners! A run of red roses zigzags across light and dark squares using the Ruby's collection by Skipping Stones Studio for Clothworks Textiles. [www.clothworkstextiles.com](http://www.clothworkstextiles.com)



A - Cut (4) 2-1/2" squares



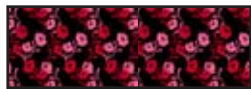
B - Cut (6) 2-1/2" squares



C - Cut (2) 2-1/2" squares



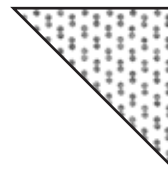
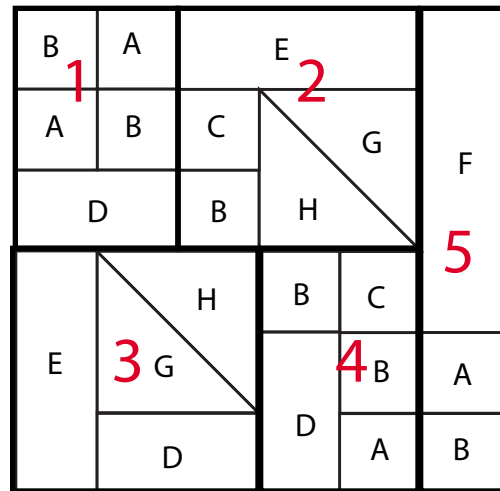
D - Cut (3) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" pieces



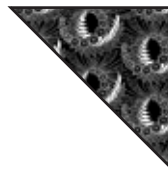
E - Cut (2) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces



F - Cut (1) 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" pieces



G - Cut (1) 4-7/8" square, then cut in half diagonally once to make (2) triangles

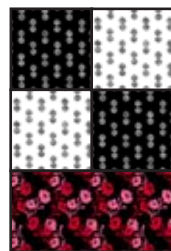


H - Cut (1) 4-7/8" square, then cut in half diagonally once to make (2) triangles

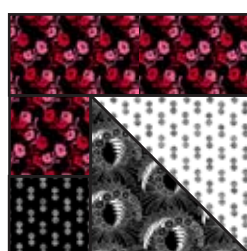
### ASSEMBLING THE BLOCK:

Refer to block picture above; sew (1) H triangle to (1) G triangle to make a square. (Make 2) Sew (1) A square to (1) B square to make a two-patch unit. (Make 4 units.) Sew (2) two-patch units together to make a four-patch square. (Make 4 four-patch squares.)

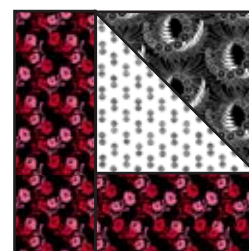
Assemble the units in each section together as shown. Sew section 1 to section 2. Stitch section 3 to section 4. Sew sections 1 & 2 to sections 3 & 4. Add section 5 to the right side to make a 12-1/2" unfinished block.

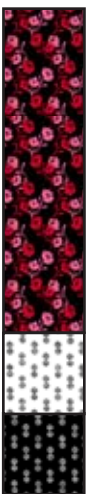
